**SUBJECT: Agenda Item 6A– 10/01/09 Board Meeting
Authorize Staff to Accept Bid from Perry Ford to Replace the South Bay
Fire Department Chief Officer Vehicle.**

SUMMARY

During the September 3, 2009 the LOCSB BODs approved a request to solicit bids to replace the South Bay Fire Department Chief Officer vehicle. Therefore, Staff sent nine Request for Proposals (RFP) to automotive dealers including Chevrolet, Ford and General Motors dealers on the central coast, from Paso Robles to Buellton. In the RFP, staff advised the dealers that the bids needed to be delivered to Station 15-South Bay no later than 3:00pm on September 23, 2009. It further stated that all bids would be opened on September 23, 2009 at 4:00 pm. Finally, the RFP further stated that if a bid was accepted, then the bid would be sent to the LOCSB BODs for approval during the October 1, 2009 BODs meeting.

On September 23, 2009 at 3:00 pm, only 4 bids had been received, in accordance with the RFP instructions and the RFP time period was closed. At 4:10, Station 15-South Bay Fire Station Staff opened the four bids received. The bids received are as follows:

- Perry Ford – 2010 Ford Expedition Four Wheel Drive SSV for \$26,864.40. Payment Terms - Net 10 days.
- Mullahey Ford – 2010 Ford Expedition for \$31,172.29. Payment Terms - Payment due 20 days after delivery.
- Rancho Grande Motors – 2010 Fleet/Non Retail GMC Yukon 4WD 4 dr 1500 Commercial TK10706 for \$34,824.44. Payment Terms – Net 10.
- Stowasser Pontiac, Buick, GMC – 2009 Yukon GMC for \$38,679.11. Payment Terms – Due at Delivery.


Complete proposal packages received from each of the four vendors have been included for your review.

RECOMMENDATION

Authorize staff to accept the lowest bid received, from Perry Ford to replace the South Bay Fire Department Chief Officer vehicle.
