1. **COSE** – PC has finished the water chapter
2. **Paso Robles Groundwater Basin Resource Capacity Study**-Agreement with Fugro and partnership approved by BOS.
3. **WRAC Member Status** – Asked BOS to consider the addition of 2 new seats: 1 agriculture specifically vineyards; 1 environmental coastal zone. Issue to be agendized.
4. **San Miguel Ranch FEIR**- Comments went to PC and recommendation to deny the project on the land use change designations.
5. **Los Osos Waste Water Project Sub-committee**
Mike Winn reported that we will not be reconvening until requested by the BOS.
6. **Grading & Stormwater Management Ordinances Sub-committee** – Haven't met yet and will attend or review PC workshop on the 22nd.

Land to Sea Advisory Committee – more discussions to be had as to our potential role and the structure that this committee may take.
