5. Presentation and Review on Financial	Interim General Manager Kampa provided a summary of the financial report as submitted with the agenda packet.	
Updates for Fund 301	The Committee discussed the on-going challenge with Reserve staffing levels and, thereby, being over-extended on GL 8295 (Reserve FF-O/T Shift Coverage). Committee Member Wright inquired regarding GL 9511 (Interfund Transfer Out) being increased to \$110,306 and the policy in which that money is withdrawn from Fund 301 throughout the fiscal year. Interim General Manager Kampa will review this and report back at the next meeting.	
	Public Comment: Richard Margetson spoke.	

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6. Discussion and Recommendation to the Board of Directors Regarding Definition of Fire Mitigation Fund	Vice Chairperson Wright informed ESAC that approximately \$165,000 was transferred from the Solid Waste fund to a newly established Fire Mitigation Fund. Wright would like to see these funds used primarily to maintain and abate overgrown vegetation, such as Bayridge and the greenbelt.	
	Battalion Chief McEwen will consult with a CAL FIRE Forester to estimate the cost to abate overgrown vegetation in key areas over the next 5 years and report back at the next meeting.	
	Chairperson Cesena will approach the BOD to possibly establish an Ad-Hoc Committee that will address hazard abatement projects, as well as review the current policy a BOD member follows to establish an Ad-Hoc Committee.	
	At 6:49 p.m., Alternate Committee Member Heyer left the dais.	
7. Discuss Hazard Abatement Requirements in Los Osos as Outlined in Title 4	Battalion Chief McEwen discussed and sought ESAC's guidance regarding the option to modify the current District Title 4 Ordinance to permit the Fire Department to either issue repeat hazard abatement offenders a misdemeanor citation and/or abate the parcel and attach any associated cost to the owner's property tax liens. This process is permitted in the City of Pismo Beach and would authorize the Fire Department another option to enforce compliance by property owners in the District. Currently, Station 15 – South Bay currently has only the option to issue a misdemeanor citation.	
	This option was supported by Committee Members Dillingham, Miller and Wright. Committee Member Tacker did not support this idea because of possible associated legal costs. ESAC further discussed utilizing the Fire Mitigation Funds for this purpose. ESAC would like to revisit this issue at the next meeting.	
8. Update on the Los Osos Habitat Conservation Plan and Section 7 Permit	Chairperson Cesena reported that County Planning has advised the next public review draft and Implementation Plan of the HCP will occur in September 2016 and the Federal Environmental Assessment is expected in October 2016 with the State Environmental Impact Report coming in December 2016. If the HCP is permitted, the County will have authority, not FWL. For that reason, the County and LOCSD will need an agreement to permit LOCSD to do abatement in particular areas, because of incidental take.	
9. Review of Board Item Regarding Monthly Fire Department Reports for October 2015, November 2015, December 2015 and Annual 2015	Battalion Chief McEwen provided an update regarding the Monthly Fire Department Reports, as included in the agenda packet. Committee Member inquired regarding a medical aid call that occurred in MDO and what the appropriate emergency response is. Public Comment: Richard Margetson spoke.	

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10. Public Comment on Items NOT Listed on this Agenda:	Richard Margetson stated that he would like ESAC to resolve the 4.0 staffing issue, GL 9511 (Interfund Transfer Out) and review the possibility of an increase in the Special Fire Tax. ESAC discussed changing the regularly scheduled ESAC meeting dates to accommodate Interim General Manager Kampa's work schedule. At this time, it was determined to maintain the current	
	meeting schedule.

12. Closing Comments by ESAC Committee Members	Committee Member Tacker welcomed Battalion Chief McEwen to the District and as a staff participant to ESAC. Committee Member Miller inquired regarding whether the lateral installation will be a burden on the Fire Department. Battalion Chief McEwen reported that impassable streets and broken gas lines are a possibility, but trench rescues will likely be unlikely as the trenches are not designed for people to be inside of. Committee Member Dillingham encouraged LOCSD to publicize the 'Call Before You Dig' information on Channel 20 and at BOD Meetings to educate residents.
