**Subject: Agenda Item 9A – May 4, 2017 Board Meeting
District /CAL FIRE Chief Report for March 2017**

EMERGENCY ACTIVITY

1. Station 15 - South Bay responded to 130 calls in March with nine Simultaneous Calls (Back to Back). All of the Simultaneous Calls required Advanced Life Support (1st: 3, 2nd: 1, Both: 5). Of these 130 incidents, 88 were Medical calls with 60 requiring Advanced Life Support provided by Paramedics; A CAL FIRE Firefighter rode in to the hospital with SLO Ambulance zero times during the month of March. No calls required Staging; Six incidents were reported as Traffic Collision; Nine incidents were reported as Fire, 27 as Public Service Assists, and six as Emergency.
2. Company 15 was called to cover the station or respond to emergencies in the month of March a total of 7 times.

ADMINISTRATION

3. During the month of March, the remaining five Station 15 – South Bay Reserve Firefighter recruits, Toby Bender, Joey De Anda, Noah Munds, Chris Wheeler and Sam Wright completed their formal training, sign off task sheets and 24 hour shadow shifts.
4. On March 1, 2017, Reserve Firefighter Jon Broyles resigned after 9 years with South Bay Fire to support his growing family. Jon wrote that he was “thankful for the role South Bay played to permanently change the course of my life. To build me, to give me the tools and to empower me.”
5. On March 9, 2017 Reserve Firefighter Casey Jenkins resigned after 3 years of service to the community of Los Osos. Casey accepted a permanent Firefighter II position with CAL FIRE/San Luis Obispo.
6. On March 16, 2017, the ZOLL X-Series Automatic External Defibrillator’s underwent their annual maintenance checks, conducted by ZOLL Medical Corporation personnel. All AED units passed inspection.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS/PROJECTS


7. From March 21-25, 2017 Cinderella Flooring completed the tile project in the kitchen, hallway and day room.
8. On March 9, 2017, the Medic Rescue returned from being serviced at Switzer Diesel Repair in Santa Margarita. Upon its return, Medic Engine 15 was taken out of service and transported to the CAL FIRE South County Shop for its annual maintenance and ladder repair. Medic Engine 15 returned on April 11, 2017. These repairs were completed as part of Schedule D of the Cooperative Fire Protection Agreement with CAL FIRE/SLO County Fire Department at no charge to the District.
9. On March 19, 2017, Medic Engine 215 was taken out of service due to an open internal switch valve in the transmission that caused the vehicle to only operate in reverse. Medic Engine 262 from Avila was provided to us at no cost. On March 22, 2017, JohnBoys towed the Engine to Brumit Diesel in Santa Maria.

TRAINING

10. On March 6, 2017, two of the nine Reserve Firefighter candidates successfully attended the Intro to Diablo Canyon and Hazard Awareness Course. This eight hour, onsite course provides an overview of plant operations, essential systems, potential accident scenarios, and other important information when responding to the Diablo Canyon Power Plant. The remaining 7 candidates attended this course in late February, 2017.
11. From March 22 through March 24, 2017, Fire Captain-Paramedic Coalwell and Fire Apparatus Engineer Walsh along with about 25 other CAL FIRE employees attended a 24 hour Continued Professional Training course taught by CAL FIRE/SLO County Fire Department Training Staff. This refresher course trained participants in auto extrication, rescue systems for ropes and ladders, CPR Training and numerous other topics. This is the 1st of 4 mandatory 24 hour annual training sessions for all CAL FIRE personnel.
12. On March 22, 2017, all established Reserve Firefighters in Company 15 attended the Diablo Canyon Power Plant Refresher Course.

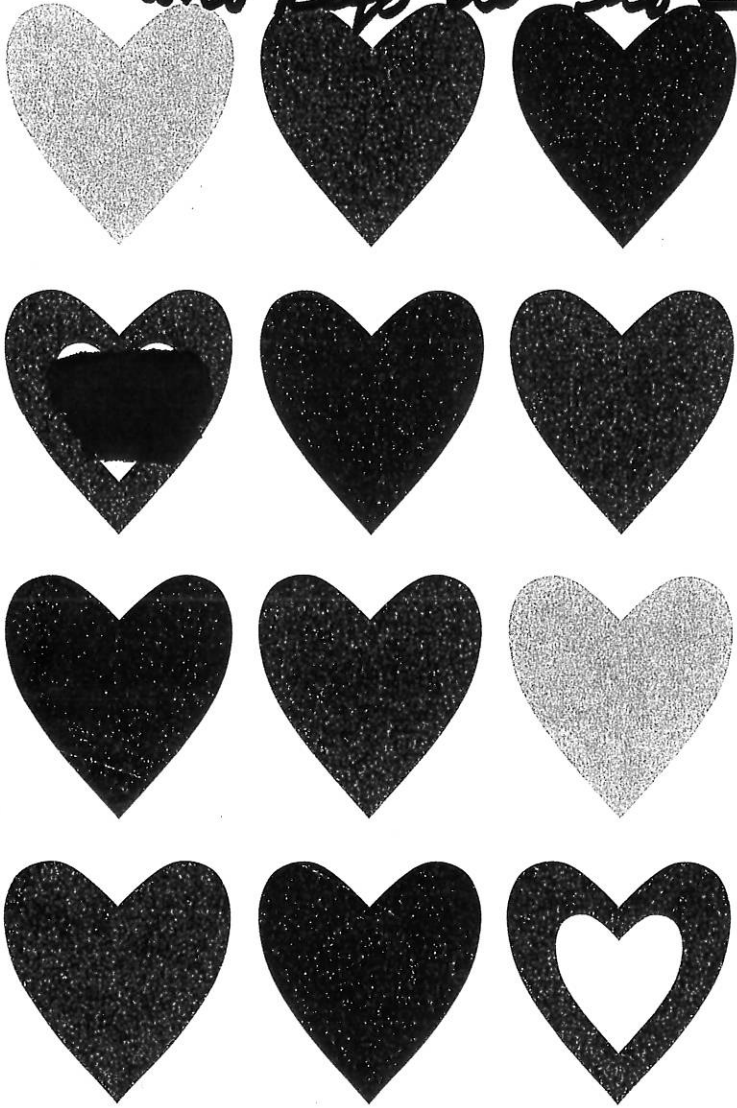
