# DISCUSSION

Staff is currently reviewing the 5-Year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) in preparation for the development of the Fund 500 2024-25 fiscal year budget. As a refresher, the projects identified in the plan are from the District's Water Master Plan developed in the early 2000's. The plan is dynamic in that it has changed as priorities change from year to year. For instance, the SCADA project was scheduled to be implemented 2022-23 fiscal year but was delayed in order to rehabilitate the north and south 16<sup>th</sup> Street water tanks. Also, staff is trying to adjust project implementation timelines to balance cashflow needed for operational requirements and account for escalating CIP project costs associated with supply chain issues and inflation over the past two years.

Attached to this report is the current 5-year CIP Plan. Because of the increased cost of the Program C Well Project, there will be a need to defer projects to a future year or modify the scope of work for projects slated for construction in 2024-25. It is the District's goal to spend approximately \$1.5 million (plus or minus) a year on projects. Because of the significant increase in the Program C Well Project costs, the fiscal year 2024-25 costs are about \$1 million over this threshold. The District did receive a \$1.5 million grant from the Department of Water Resources for the Program C Well Project which has notably helped the financial position of Fund 500. That said, staff will be looking at ways to reduce the CIP budget for the upcoming budget. The following table shows the project currently slated for the 2024-25 fiscal year.

Some ideas that staff are looking at to reduce the CIP costs are:

- Prioritizing the condition of the main line valves and phasing the replacements over a 2-to-3year period
- Deferring the El Moro pipeline upgrade to fiscal year 2027-28
- Deferring the water yard building remodel to fiscal year 2027-28
- Deferring the heavy equipment storage structure fiscal year 2025-26
