<p>2. PUBLIC SAFETY REPORTS</p> <p>A. Fire Department Report</p> <p>B. Sheriff Department Report</p> <p>C. California Highway Patrol Report</p>	<p>Fire Captain and EMT Sam McElhinney reported on 95 calls for November 2025, accepting applications for Reserve Firefighters, a garage door replacement, prescribed burns scheduled for late October through June 2026, vegetation management in Monarch Grove, and Station 15 participating in Veterans Day services and collecting food and toys.</p> <p>Public Comment - None</p> <p>No Report</p> <p>Lieutenant James Ferguson reported nine accidents in November 2025, including one with major injuries and property damage, and 395 enforcement area stops resulting in 10 DUI arrests. He also thanked those who reported suspicious drivers.</p> <p>Public Comment – Robert Bergman thanked Lieutenant Ferguson and inquired about the number of vehicle tag violations in Los Osos over the last month and whether this information was available. He also asked about any agreement between the CHP and the Sheriff's Department concerning vehicle tag violations.</p> <p>Lieutenant Ferguson responded there is no specific agreement, and both can enforce certain laws.</p> <p>Robert Bergman commented on a sheriff's refusal to contact the CHP regarding a neighbor's violation of out-of-state plates, and after a CHP officer responded to Bergman's call, the violations were not resolved.</p> <p>Lieutenant Ferguson informed Bergman about a website where the public can report vehicles with out-of-state plates illegally operating in California.</p>
