Agenda Item 9A – May 1, 2014 Board Meeting District /CAL FIRE Chief Report for March 2014

EMERGENCY ACTIVITY

- 1. Station 15 South Bay responded to 102 calls in March with 11 Simultaneous Calls (Back to Back). Six of the Simultaneous Calls required Advanced Life Support (1st: 1, 2nd: 5). Of these 102 incidents, 72 were Medical calls with 42 requiring Advanced Life Support provided by Paramedics. Seven incidents were reported as Traffic Collision; Seven incidents were reported as Fire, 18 as Public Service Assists, and five as Emergency.
- 2. Company 15 was called to cover the station or respond to emergencies in the month of March a total of 13 times.

ADMINISTRATION

- 3. On March 4, 2014, Reserve Firefighter J. Curtis Reid submitted a letter of resignation, effective immediately. Curtis was a valuable member of the Department for over 1 year and resigned to pursue a career as a Paramedic. We wish him the very best in his future endeavors.
- 4. On March 8, 2014, Prospective Reserve Firefighter candidate, Tyler Lee, was dismissed from the Paid-Call Firefighter Academy for a manipulative evaluation failure. Tyler informed staff that he will submit an application during the next hiring process and continue his efforts to become a fully qualified LOCSD Reserve Firefighter.
- 5. On March 10, 2014, Reserve Firefighter Stephanie Dininni was granted a Leave of Absence to attend to personal temporary commitments with the intention of returning to Active status no later than September, 2014.
- 6. In late March, Fire Apparatus Engineer Paramedic Neal Moriarty was promoted within CAL FIRE to Fire Captain Paramedic in the San Mateo/Santa Cruz Unit. Neal has been an important and respected member of Station 15 South Bay for almost 10 years. He was an excellent Instructor in Water Rescue Operations, and acted as Communications Manager for the last several years. We wish Neal success in his endeavors and are glad that he is still a member of the CAL FIRE team.

TRAINING

7. The prospective Station 15 – South Bay Reserve Firefighter candidates continued completing steps required to become LOCSD Reserve Firefighters. On March 9, three of the candidates completed the Paid-Call Firefighter Academy. A fourth candidate continued the Firefighter I Academy at Allan Hancock Community College during March, at his own expense. On March 22nd, three of the four candidates attended the 7-Hour State Fire Marshal Confined Space Awareness course. This course teaches students what an OSHA Permit Required Confined Space is, how to recognize Confined Space emergencies, and steps they can take to start a non-entry rescue of someone trapped in a confined space. The fourth candidate will receive equivalent training within the Firefighter I Academy.

TRAINING

- 8. On March 25, 27, 29 and 30, 2014, three of the four prospective Station 15 South Bay Reserve Firefighter candidates also attended a required 40-hour Haz Mat FRO/Decon Course. This course instructs students regarding recognizing hazardous materials, understanding laws associated with hazardous materials and various methods and paperwork involved with the transport for hazardous materials. This course provides the basic knowledge to emergency responders that may be sent to incidents that involve hazardous materials. Finally, the course prepared emergency responders to decontaminate other emergency responders and civilians should they become contaminated with hazardous materials. The fourth candidate will receive equivalent training within the Firefighter I Academy.
- 9. From March 20 March 22, 2014, Fire Captain Paramedic Coalwell along with about 25 other CAL FIRE employees attended a 24 hour Continued Professional Training course taught by CAL FIRE/SLO County Fire Department Training Staff. Assisting the training staff was Station 15 Fire Apparatus Engineer Paramedic Moriarty and Battalion Chief Veneris. This refresher course trained participants in rescue systems for ropes and ladders, gas pipe line emergencies, CPR Training and numerous other topics. This is the last of 4 mandatory 24 hour annual training sessions for all CAL FIRE personnel.
- 10. From March 24 27, 2014, Executive Assistant Harmony Brown attended a 24-hour course held by the Cal Chief's Administrative Fire Services Section in Sacramento, CA. This State-wide annual Academy instructed students on a variety of subjects, including the changing culture of the fire service, effective leadership in the work-place, generational diversity, Brown Act/Public Records Act and the Firefighter Bill of Rights. Harmony was awarded a Scholarship as a first-time attendee that paid for her Course Registration and Hotel fees. All other associated fees were paid for by CAL FIRE/County of San Luis Obispo.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS/PROJECTS

- 11. On March 8, 2014 Station 15 South Bay Staff met with CAL FIRE/SLO County Fire Department Staff for an Insurance Service Organization (ISO) Periodic Review Kick Off Meeting. The intent of this meeting was to gather information and confirm statistics for the ISO. The insurance industry uses information produced by the ISO to set insurance rates in California.
- 12. On March 26, 2014, Station 15 South Bay Staff was using the LOCSD's Chipper when the drive belt broke. Station 15 South Bay Staff made arrangements to repair the chipper, through the SLO County Fire Safe Council and Los Osos Focus Group Chipping Grants awarded to the Los Osos area. The Chipper required repair to the belt pulley, bearing and a replacement of the drive belt. This repair cost \$844 and was paid for in full by the San Luis Obispo Fire Safe Council as part of the Cabrillo Heights Project.


