2. Discussions and Recommendations to the Board Regarding Potential Changes to Water Rates and Water Rate Structure 1. Review and/or Potential Changes of Reserve Policies 2. Possible Additional Factors	Chairperson Ochylski provided background information; set the process of the meeting as a free forum with members interacting freely; and introduced the Water Rate Group, District Engineer Rob Miller, UAC Member Ron Munds, and Richard Margetson. Engineer Miller provide a PowerPoint presentation. The group created a revenue calculator which can run scenarios based on recent water sales data can calculate how much revenue may be received in any given fiscal year in each of the tiers and how that will compare to expenses. The Group discussed key drivers including reserves, operating expenses, and Admin overhead. The Committees discussed leaving the funds in the Water Conservation reserve as is, move into another reserve, or leave in operating budget.	Action: The Committee recommended that the Board: 1. Reallocate \$25,000 from Water Conservation Reserve into the General Contingency Reserve. 2. Allocate \$500,000 the first year, \$700,000 the second year, and \$900,000 the third year to the Capital Outlay Reserve.
	Public Comment – None The Committees unanimously recommended that the Board reallocate \$25,000 from Water Conservation Reserve into the General Contingency Reserve. The Committees discussed the Capital Outlay Reserves and the critical infrastructure needs and revenue stability.	3. Allocate 25% of the property tax from Water the first year, 12.5% of the property tax from Water the second year, and 12.5% of the property tax from Water the third year with a policy of 100% eventually coming out of
	The Committees unanimously recommended that the Board allocate \$500,000 the first year, \$700,000 the second year, and \$900,000 the third year to the Capital Outlay Reserve. Engineer Miller provided a brief background of the property tax division inherited from CSA 9 in which non-District water customers don't directly benefit. The Committees discussed property taxes benefiting the entire District not only LOCSD water customers. Public Comment – Julie Tacker supported property taxes benefiting Fire or a Basin benefit. Richard Margetson supported a portion of property taxes benefitting Fire to reach 4.0 staffing goal.	Water.

	Committee Member Womack moved to recommend that the Board take 50% over three years with a policy of 100% eventually. The motion was seconded by Committee Burns and passed 9-1-0.	
	Committee Member Womack moved to recommend that the Board take 25% of the property tax from Water the first year, 12.5% of the property tax from Water the second year, and 12.5% of the property tax from Water the third year. The motion was seconded by Committee Harry and passed unanimously.
