SUBJECT: Agenda Item 5D – 07/06/2023 Board of Directors Meeting Utilities Department Report for May 2023

WATER PRODUCTION INFORMATION

The total production for the month of **May 2023** was approximately **14.7 million gallons** (**MG**) which equates to an average daily demand of approximately **474,000 gallons**. This represents a **1.08% increase** in production when compared to last year.

Using the state's formula to calculate residential usage per capita per day, for the month of **May 2023** our residential customers used **63.9** gallons per person per day, an **increase** from 62.7 gallons per person per day in May 2022.

PRODUCTION AND RUNTIME HOURS BY WELL SITE

The following tables break down the production by well site and runtime on the pump motors for the month of **May 2023**. Totals for last year are included for comparison:

Utility Department Updates

Bay Oaks Well (formerly Program C Well)

The well equipping design phase of the project is nearly complete. Final comments and some clean-up of the plans and specification are being finalized. The project will most likely go out to bid in August. The water transmission main project is set to start in July with the major construction beginning in August. Completion of this phase is anticipated by late October. Staff is working our consultant team to resolve the electrical panel delay issues that surfaced recently. The manufacturer of the panel indicated that it will take 500 days or over 71 weeks for delivery. We are looking at alternatives to cut down the delivery time.

Weed Abatement Activities on District Properties Complete

Annually, the water crew is responsible for clearing weeds and debris from District owned properties. Because of the winter rains, this was no easy task this year with some properties requiring multiple removal work. Many thanks to the crew for their diligence in this very labor-intensive work.
